Columbus Economic Summit—On Our Way Out of the Recession

Presenters at the Nebraska Economy Forum weighed in earlier this month with their thoughts on the state's economic recovery:

- Richard Baier of the NE Department of Economic Development reported that the areas of financial growth are: tourism, IT & equipment, renewable energy, wind power, solar, geothermal, data centers and biotech in the area of agriculture.
- Eric L. Thompson from the Bureau of Business Research stated that there will be a slow growth of about 3% or so, and that the major industries of Agriculture and Insurance have helped our economy here in Nebraska.
- While Ernie Goss felt that our government is too aggressive and lacks clarity at this point, he did agree that biofuels and alternative fuel production are helping us. He was concerned about the affects of the Health Care Reform and the Cap & Trade bills.
- Cathy Lang – NE Workforce Development—stated that even though we have not had to borrow to fund our unemployment costs there will be an increase of 150%. Ms Lang also reported that there are grants available for energy jobs and training grants for employers.

ICE Announces I-9 Audits

The Jackson-Lewis group reported that on November 19, 2009 the Department of Homeland Security's Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) announced that they are delivering more I-9 audit notices to 1,000 employers across the country associated with the critical infrastructure.

“From initial reports, it appears that the notices are primarily subpoenas for I-9 and supporting documentation. Employers that receive audit notices should make careful note of the date by which a response must be submitted to ICE and contact their immigration counsel as soon as possible to review the subpoena and coordinate their responses. Employers should avoid any detailed discussion of their I-9 processes with the ICE representative.”
